

Wilmot United Church Music Ministry

<u>Music Leader</u>



Wilmot's music ministry is lead by Director of Music Steven Peacock. Steven conducts the Senior and Handbell Choirs, and he oversees the musical content of our worship services, which regularly feature his skills as a classical guitarist, singer, djembe player and arranger/composer.



Frank T. Pridham Memorial Handbell Choir

The Frank T. Pridham Memorial Handbell Choir is a three-octave choir which performs at worship services about once a month between September and May. Our rehearsals take place in the Godly Play Room every Thursday night between 6:30 and 7:30 p.m., and the musical challenges are always balanced with lots of camaraderie. Wilmot Senior Choir



The Wilmot Senior Choir is a four-part (SATB) chorus which sings music in a range of classical and contemporary sacred styles. We rehearse in the choir loft from 7:30 to 8:45 p.m. on Thursday nights from September to May, and we warm up for Sunday worship half an hour before each service begins. The Senior Choir is a user-friendly group that combines solid music making and fun in a nurturing and positive environment. New singers are always very welcome!

Other Ensembles and Soloists

Wilmot often welcomes a variety of smaller vocal and instrumental ensembles (such as the Youth Chime Choir) to special services throughout the year. As well, vocal, and instrumental soloists (and, on occasion, music professionals) from within and beyond the Wilmot congregation are a regular feature of our worship services. Steven provides rehearsal preparation, accompaniments, and arrangements for these musicians, with the goal of positive and worshipful musical experiences for our performers and our congregation.

Wilmot Church Council

Wilmot Church Council is comprised of representatives from all our Committees, our Regional Representatives, the Council chair, secretary and treasurer, and our minister. As the official governing body of the congregation, it is responsible for making major decisions for the congregation between annual meetings. It also provides support and guidance to committees, groups and individuals and facilitates communication among various parts of the congregation. Our Council meets the 4th Wednesday in the months of March, May, September and November, 7:00 to 9:00 pm in the Board Room. Between meetings, the Council Executive, consisting of chair, secretary, treasurer, two Council representatives, and the clergy acts on behalf of Council.

Ministry and Personnel Committee

This committee (mandatory by the United Church of Canada) has responsibilities typical of a 'Human Resources Management Dept' such as salaries, posting non-clergy job positions, writing job descriptions, interviews, benefits, working conditions, annual reviews. M&P reports to and makes recommendations to our governing body, the Council, for decision making as needed. Members (5-6) liaise with/represent one of our staff, but we work together sharing everyone's knowledge, skills, wisdom as we carry out the committee's business. Committee members meet together approx. 4-5x a year, use email, and meet/ communicate with the staff they represent as needed. The United Church has valuable resources to assist us with policies and procedures. Besides supporting our paid staff, M&P has a responsibility to be an 'ear & voice' for Wilmot members and adherents especially in relation to

Wilmot Staff roles. We welcome any comments (positive and contrary) and concerns. As one of our M&P committee members said "Being a part of the M&P committee has given me a greater appreciation and knowledge of the work done in a church, behind the scenes." 


FAITH FORMATION

Bud Bird by forming a joint committee to examine how we might enhance Downtown United so that the two Churches might thrive and through collaboration be of greater service to the Fredericton community. The committee was composed of four people from St. Paul's (Rev. Michelle Armstrong, Ralph Simpson, Derrick Grant and Mel McGuigan) and four people from Wilmot (Rev. The committee worked with Cathy Stewart and Marijke Strong of Credence & Co. to produce a final report in the fall of 2023 summarizing their work and providing a blueprint for further collaboration. The remaining recommendations which require further discussion between Wilmot and St. Paul's have been postponed until fall 2024 at St. Paul's request.




Our <u>Prayer Circle</u>



Access to Justice

We educate ourselves and write our concerns for Access to Justice for those without sufficient economic means to bring their needs to government. Learning and understanding is necessary for social justice, and we use various formats during and outside of Sunday worship to present justice issues.
